

Course Summary

Participants will learn and apply fundamental skills in planning, communication, leadership, safety, wellness and inclusion that consider their contribution within diverse community groups, using the sport of Basketball for context. In association with Basketball SA, this pathway is also designed to progress participants in the sport of Basketball at a community, or Club level.

Learning outcomes are combined for advancing player skills, knowledge and performance, as well as promoting personal health and personal leadership (Community Role Model), the role and responsibilities of a Community Basketball Coach and Referee (Service Provider) and the Assistant Community Services worker coordinating work activities within a community development framework, where the opportunity exists to work with diverse people and offer assistance as first point of contact.
